


- **What are some of the topics and skills that you will cover**

Below are some of the topics and skills that we will cover during the course:

Changing Awareness of Crime: Gain an awareness of different types of crime and deviance. Discover why some crimes go unreported and find out how the media can distort perceptions on crime. Learn how to create your own campaign to elicit changes to crime/law.

Criminological Theories: Learn to evaluate criminological theories and know the different debates relating to these. You will gain the ability to explain certain criminal acts with an application of theory.

Crime Scene to Court Room: By the end of the unit you will be able to review criminal cases, evaluate evidence and determine whether verdicts are safe and just.

Crime and Punishment: Learn how the Criminal Justice system in England and Wales operates. Gain an understanding of social control and evaluate its effectiveness.

This will allow you to offer multiple explanations for criminality.</p> <p>Many of these theories feed into policy making to prevent crime.</p>
