Welcome to A Level Textile Design




Below are some of the subjects that you will be learning when you join us at Burnley College.

What are some of the subjects and skills that you will cover:

- Research Methods- explore, research and acquire techniques to develop skills, knowledge and understanding using a range of textile media.
- Areas of Study- garments/fashion, accessories, soft furnishings, printed/dyed fabrics, constructed textiles, textile installation, and expressive textiles.
- Skills- recording experiences and observations, undertake research and gathering information, understand applications to the chosen work, understanding and applying formal elements, using appropriate visual language and terminology, understand the relationship of form and function within Textile Design.
- Knowledge and Understanding- use an appropriate range of processes and techniques
 using traditional and non-traditional techniques appropriate to chosen subject area
 enabling research, exploration and the creation of the final outcome.
