- Physics grade 6
- Chemistry grade 6
- Biology grade 6
- English Language grade 5
- Maths grade 6
- Any additional subjects grade 5

#### What will you learn?

The T-Level in Health is designed to help you gain the knowledge and skills you need for the health sector. During your first year, you will study examined topics on the health and science sector, including providing person-centred care, good scientific and clinical practice, infection control and health and wellbeing. You will also complete an employer set project where you will demonstrate the wider skills you have learnt such as communication, teamwork and reflective writing.

In the second year, you will focus on an occupational specialism (supporting the adult nursing team), where you learn 'on the job' skills to support adult nurses in their daily and clinical tasks. This will be undertaken in college and supported during your time in placement.

### Assessment:

Year 1 70% Core Exams; 30% Employer Set Project
