- What are some of the topics and skills that you will cover:

- Research Methods- learning the strengths and weaknesses of the methods sociologists use to gather their data and make their theories e.g. questionnaires and interviews.
- Education- including how factors such as class and gender affect your achievement.
- Families & Households- how the family has changed over time and what factors have contributed to this.
- Beliefs in Society- how belief and religion has changed, what the purpose of religion is and whether we are more or less religious now.
- Crime & Deviance Causes of crime, relationship between class, gender and ethnicity and crime as well as sociological perspectives on crime.
